SUPPLEMENTARY SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SSI)

This sheet, including attachments, is a supplement to Appendix S of the Racing Rules of Sailing (page 146 RRS 2021-2024).

1 RULES (SI 1)

- 1.1 The Yachting New Zealand Safety Regulations Part 1 shall apply.
Refer - <http://www.yachtingnz.org.nz/racing/safety-regulations>
- 1.2 RRS 40.1, *Personal Flotation Devices*, shall apply at all times while afloat.
- 1.3 Appendix T, *Arbitration* shall apply.
- 1.4 Under RRS 86, *Changes to The Racing Rules* the following racing rules will be changed as follows:
 - RRS A5.1 and A5.2 will be changed to state that a boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start,
 - RRS A5.1 will be changed to state that the Race Committee may award a boat still racing a place on the water even though that boat may not have completed the course and/or is unlikely to complete the course within the time limit. Any such boat shall not be better placed than those boats that have completed the course, or rounded more marks. The Race Committee shall notify the boat(s) concerned at the time, and may instruct the boat(s) to return to the starting area or go ashore
- 1.5 **Covid:**
All NZ Govt regulations concerning the use of masks, vaccinations, scanning and social distancing shall apply at all times before, during and after the event.
The MBSC Covid Policy shall apply to all sailors, their parents and supporters at all times. This includes, all sailors, supporters and parents at the event must be vaccinated. Proof of vaccination must be provided at or before registration.



2 NOTICE TO COMPETITORS (SI 2)

- 2.1 The race office is located on the second floor of the Murrays Bay Sailing Club clubrooms.
- 2.2 The official notice board will be located on the main floor of the Murrays Bay Sailing Club clubrooms.
- 2.3 The online official notice board is located at www.murraysbay.org

3 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE (SI 4)

- 3.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagstaff located in front of the clubrooms.
- 3.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, “1 minute” is replaced with “not less than 20 minutes” in Race Signals AP.
- 3.3 [DP] Flag D with one sound signal means “Boats shall not leave the shore until this signal is made. The warning signal will not be made before the scheduled time or less than 20 minutes after flag D is displayed.”

4 SCHEDULE OF RACES (SI 5)

4.1 *Briefing:*

4.2 *Racing:*

Note: This changes NOR 8.3

- 4.3 The Target Time for each race is 30 minutes.
- 4.4 On Sunday 12th December, no warning signal will be made after 18:30.

5 CLASS FLAG (SI 6)

- 5.1 [DP] The class flag shall be a black “P” on a white background.

6 COURSES (SI 7)

- 6.1 The courses to be sailed, the order in which the marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left are shown in Attachment A.
- 6.2 In the event that a gate mark is missing and has not been replaced with an object displaying flag M, the remaining gate mark shall be rounded to port.

7 MARKS (SI 8)

- 7.1 The description of the marks is below the course diagrams in Attachment A.



8 THE START (SI 9)

8.1 A boat starting more than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and 5.2.

9 TIME LIMITS (SI 12)

9.1

9.2 There is no prescribed time limit for the first boat to pass mark 1. Appendix S, SI 12.2 is deleted.

10 PROTEST AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

10.1 Immediately after finishing a boat intending to protest shall, in addition to the requirements of rule 61.1(a), inform the race committee boat at the finishing line of her intention to protest and the identity of the boat(s) being protested. The protesting boat must receive an acknowledgement from the race committee. This changes RRS 61.

10.2 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a protest committee decision shall be delivered:

- (a) within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day,
- (b) no later than 30 minutes after the party was informed of the decision on the day.

This changes RRS 62.2.

11 SAFETY REGULATIONS

11.1 [DP] Boats not leaving the shore for a scheduled race shall promptly notify the race office.

11.2 [DP] The official Check-Out and Check-In Sheets will be located adjacent to the ramp and will be overseen by a member of the Race Committee.

- (a) Competitors shall individually check-out before racing by personally providing their sail number and name to the member of the Race Committee overseeing the check-out sheets. Failure to complete Check-out may result in the competitor being scored DNC for all races that day.

- (b) Competitors shall individually check-in immediately on returning to shore after racing, no later than the protest time limit by personally signing the check-in sheets. Failure to complete Check-in may result in the competitor being scored DNC for all races that day.

11.3 [DP] A boat retiring from racing shall notify the Race Committee before leaving the racing area, or if that is not possible, shall notify the race office as soon as possible after returning ashore.



12 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 12.1 [DP] Substitution of competitors is not allowed without the prior written approval of the Protest Committee.
- 12.2 [DP] Substitution of damaged or lost equipment is not allowed unless authorised in writing by the Protest Committee. Requests for substitution shall be made to the committee at the first reasonable opportunity, which may be after the race.

13 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 13.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions.
- 13.2 [DP] When instructed by a race official on the water, a boat shall proceed to a designated area for inspection.

14 SUPPORT BOATS

- 14.1 [DP] All support boats must register with the Organising Authority at registration and nominate the boat(s) they support.
- 14.2 [DP] All support and coach boats must have VHF communications and be available to assist the race committee if required.
- 14.3 [DP] All support and coach boats shall have an engine safety cut out switch (kill cord) attached to the driver at all times while the engine is running, unless prior written exemption has been provided by the Organising Authority.
- 14.4 [DP] Except when requested to participate in rescue operations, team support boats and other support persons shall stay outside areas where boats are racing and are restricted to a 5 knot speed limit, from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement or abandonment of all races. The areas the boats are racing in is defined as the area inside the course and within 50 metres of any mark, lay line, starting line, finishing line or any area where any boat that is racing, is sailing or may sail.
- 14.5 [DP] When flag V (with a long sound signal) is displayed on a committee boat all support boats are requested to remain afloat and assist all sailors.

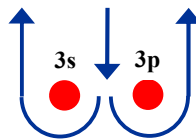
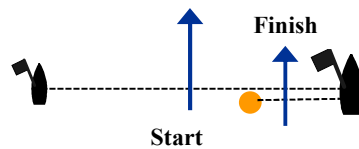
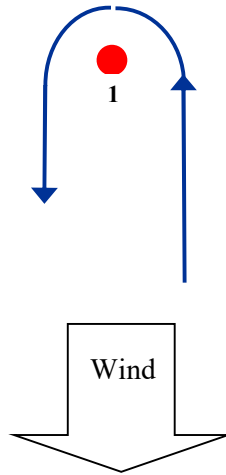

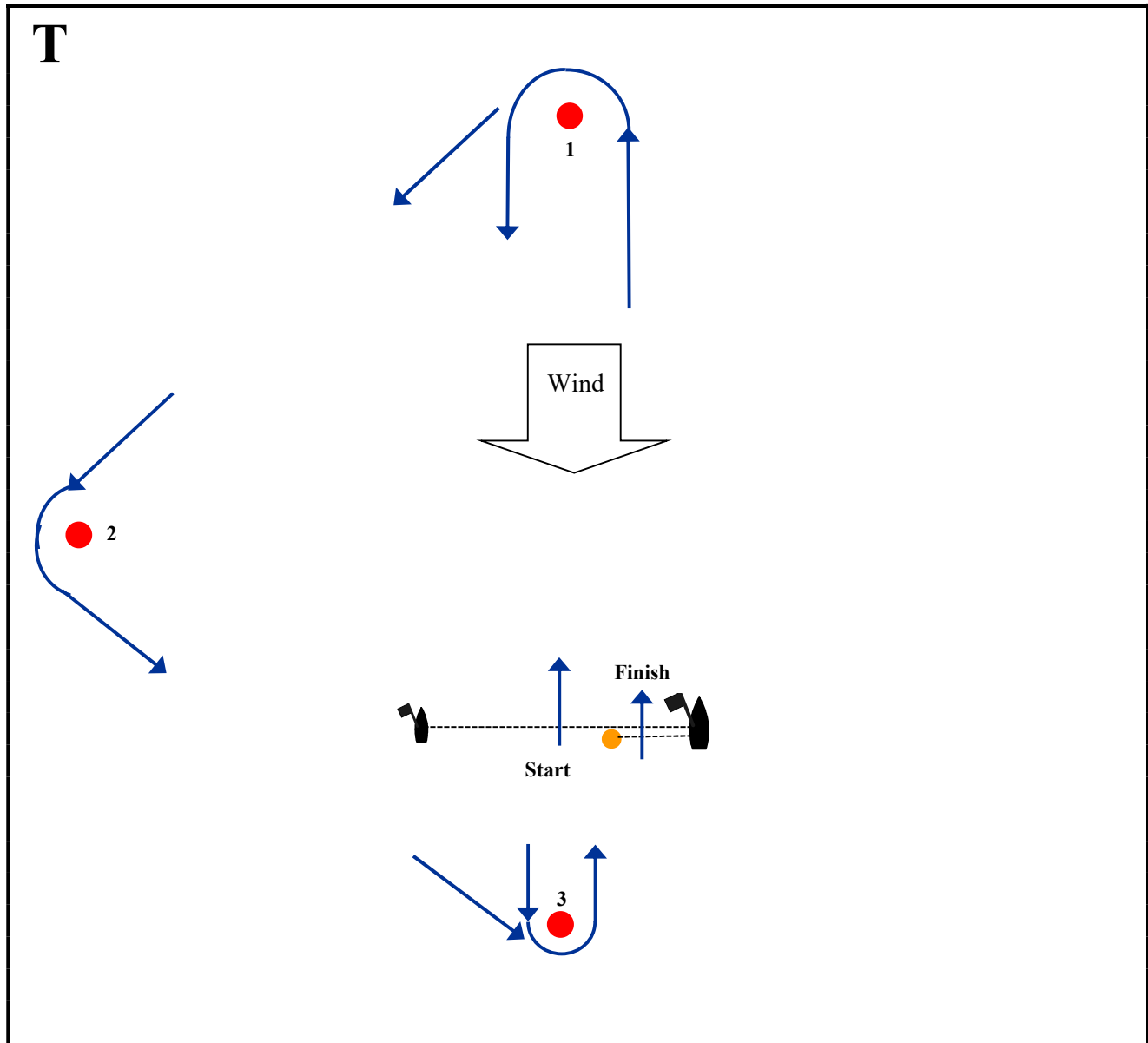
